hen Melissa Keeven's parents invited Colton Rademacher to attend a thresher show, neither knew that day would change their lives. "I guess I knew her dad before I met her," Colton said. "Then, really, we met at the show in Rosebud. Her parents invited me to come along with them to another show, then at that show, me and her kind of got to talking, and I asked her if she wanted to go with me to another show that next weekend."

Their first date was on Sept. 7, 2019.

Colton's great-grandfather was a charter member of the Owensville Thresher's Association, so he grew up going to shows. Melissa's family joined later, but the thresher's association has been a big part of their lives. Melissa's parents are Larry and Sarah Keeven, and Colton's are Daryl and Crystal Rademacher.

"A couple weeks in, after we started dating, I pretty

much knew she was the one," said Colton, who proposed on April 23, 2022. "We bought a house in February, and we kind of had a housewarming party, and I asked her then."

Melissa wanted a rustic but classy wedding. The couple chose White Mule Winery for their venue and catering. Kathy Echols made their cakes. The photographer was Sunny Sky Photography, and JD Imagery provided videography. The couple did their own flowers.

We kind of had an idea of what we wanted, and we kind of just went with the flow," Colton said. "It kind of just fell together."

Melissa added, "My parents and sisters really helped out a bunch with the decorating and everything beforehand." Colton used two of his tractors as decorations, and the groom's cake featured a topper depicting a bride trying to

pull her groom away from a tractor. Melissa found her A-line, backless dress at Wedding Creations in Washington. "The dress just kind of suited to me," she said. "I had a day when I was trying on a whole bunch of them, and I just kept saying, 'No, I think I like that dress.' And you always want to stick to the gut of what you like because then you'll regret it down the line."

#### I've never been this close to anyone or anything ...

They were married on May 6, 2023. Colton said he wrote his vows the morning of the wedding. Melissa wrote hers a week or two in advance. The couple chose not to see each other before the ceremony.

"We kind of both got dressed at the B&B there at White Mule, but any time he was coming in, I went and hid so he couldn't see me in my dress," Melissa said, adding that her mom, sisters, and bridesmaids were with her.

The first reveal with her dad on the day of the wedding was a moment Melissa will always remember. "I didn't let him see my dress until the day of the wedding either, until right before we were walking down (to the) ceremony, and I did a whole first-look reveal, and I made him cry," she said.

Their wedding song was "Amazed" by Lonestar. Colton said during their first dance, it was like they were the only people in

## Songs tailor-made for father-daughter dances

eddings can be as novel or traditional as couples prefer. Couples who go the traditional route will undoubtedly include certain spotlight dances in the reception.

The father-daughter dance is a staple of a wedding reception. According to the experts at Fred Astaire Dance Studios, the history of father-daughter dances can be traced back decades. The dance once was one last nod to Dad before the bride's husband became the most important man in her life. Now it's more symbolic of general love and affection.

Times have certainly changed from the first father-daughter dances and this tradition no longer carries the same meaning. ## Did you know?

A number of variables affect how much engaged couples will spend on their weddings. Personal preferences, location and the season in which couples get married are just some of the factors that can affect the final cost of a wedding. However, one aspect couples can count on regarding wedding spending is the reception will likely require the most significant financial investment. The Knot 2022 Real Weddings Study found that the average cost of a wedding in 2022 was \$30,000. The study also found that the biggest investment couples make is the venue. Couples indicated they spent about 37 percent of their overall budget on a wedding venue. Though some couples may spend more than that and others may spend less, engaged couples currently planning their weddings should know that the cost of the venue where they will tie the knot will likely end up requiring the most significant investment of any component related to their wedding.

# How to build a wedding budget

edding planning is a unique experience unlike any endeavor most couples will ever encounter. Much effort goes into planning a wedding, and that includes building a budget that ensures the big day will be fun without breaking the bank.

Most couples planning a wedding have never tied the knot before, so it can be difficult to determine a reasonable amount to spend. It's easy to go overboard when planning a wedding, and couples may find their list of wants and, consequently, their expenses, growing as they get into the weeds of wedding planning. Though it might require some difficult decisions, couples can keep these tips in mind so they can build a wedding budget that won't land them in debt after saying, "I do."

- Determine funding. The days when a bride's parents would finance the wedding entirely on their own are largely a thing of the past. According to a recent WeddingWire Newlywed Report, parents now pay for 52 percent of wedding expenses. As couples begin establishing a wedding budget, it's imperative that they first determine who, if anyone, will be helping them finance the big day. Fifty-two percent of wedding expenses is a significant amount of money, but in that scenario, couples will still need to come up with roughly half of the money needed to fund their weddings. Couples without substantial savings may be forced to cut back in order to avoid beginning their life as a married couple in debt.
- Make a list of potential expenses. Location will be a significant factor when determining potential expenses. For example, a 2022 ValuePenguin analysis of data from The Wedding Report found that the average wedding in Massachusetts cost roughly \$30,500 in 2020, while couples tying the knot in Arkansas spent around \$12,500 on their weddings. With such wild fluctuations, it's important that couples get an accurate estimate of how much it may cost them to get married in a given city. Couples who met in a city and still live in a city but grew up in a suburb might save a considerable sum by getting married in their hometowns. Compare and contrast prices in locales you're considering, and then build your budget accordingly. This can help you avoid sticker shock and going over budget. Notable expenses to budget include the venue, attire (i.e., wedding dress and tuxedo rental), hairstyle and makeup, entertainment, photography, and transportation, among others.
- Make a list of what's most important. Most couples will have to compromise in order to avoid taking on debt to finance

their weddings. An earnest discussion about what's most important to each person can ensure you both get what you want. Each person can make a list of their priorities, ranking them from most important to least important. Once lists are shared, couples can see where their priorities converge and where they diverge. Any items that rank low on each person's list of priorities can be afforded less funding, while those that are high on each list can take up more of the budget, if necessary.

• Commit to a limit before spending a dime. Committing to a limit before spending a dime can help couples keep wedding costs more manageable. Once that number is defined, couples can then work within its parameters, which can make potentially difficult decisions a little easier by narrowing options at a time when options can seem endless.

A well-planned budget can be just what couples need to begin married life on strong financial footing.







## Options abound when shopping for wedding reception venues

## Time-honored wedding traditions

eddings are special events that celebrate two individuals' love for one another. Weddings bring together friends and family to witness couples share vows and devote their lives to each other.

Wedding guests recognize that certain components are commonplace in ceremonies and receptions. Perhaps you were once a ring bearer or caught the bouquet? There's a rich history behind the traditions that feature prominently at many weddings. Here's a look at traditions past and present and the meaning behind these customs.

#### Marriage

The custom of marriage can be traced back thousands of years to when hunters and gatherers started coming together to form societies and farm land. In order to ensure the success of communities, couplings were developed to produce offspring and maintain households.

Getting married is sometimes referred to as "tying the knot." This stems from the custom of "handfasting," which is a common practice among various cultures around the world, and notably in ancient Rome. The bride and groom's hands are tied together for the duration of the ceremony, not to be released until the wedding is made official. This isn't something you see too often at modern weddings, but can be something unique couples may want to consider.

#### **Bridal bouquet**

A bouquet of beautiful flowers is held by the bride on her wedding day. Roses, orchids, peonies, and other fragrant blooms are often included, but in ancient times brides' bouquets were likely made of herbs. According to the resource Minted Weddings, these aromatic herbs

were used to ward off evil spirits.

Evil spirits also were the basis for the wearing of bridal veils, as they were utilized to hide brides from these miscreants. Veils now are more style than substance.

#### **Bridesmaids**

In ancient Rome, bridesmaids were tasked with protecting the bride. They wore the same dresses as the bride to confuse evil spirits from finding the soon-to-be-betrothed and cursing her. Today's bridesmaids are less decoy and more helper. They may wear similar dresses to the bride and one another, but they aren't trying to fool any spirits.

#### **Tossing rice**

Rice and grains were long regarded as signs of prosperity and fertility, according to the gifting company Personal Creations. Therefore, couples were showered with rice to ensure their good fortune. Consumption of uncooked rice has been proven to be detrimental to some wildlife, so rice has now been widely replaced with bubbles or birdseed.

#### **Cutting the cake**

At the reception, many couples link hands and make the first cut in their wedding cakes. Wedding Wire says it's a tradition that around 80 percent of wedding couples partake in. It is believed this tradition symbolizes the couple's first official task performed together, and marks the promise to support and take care of one another throughout the marriage. However, in the past, brides were responsible for cutting the wedding cake alone and distributed slices to guests to aid in fertility, according to BakingNook.com.

## Questions to ask when vetting wedding vendors

The process of planning a wedding involves the coordination of many different components, including people. It can be stressful and it can be exciting. Chances are the couple-to-be will be handling conversations with vendors they may have never worked with before.

It may be tempting to simply sign on the dotted line when hiring wedding vendors and hope for the best. But the process can prove more fruitful when couples prepare for it by compiling a list of questions designed to ensure they know what they're getting before they enter into a contract.

#### Is the date available?

The most important question to ask is whether the vendor is available on the day you have chosen to get married. The house of worship or place where you will be exchanging vows should be set first, and then additional vendors can be interviewed to confirm their availability and the scope of their services.

#### How long have you been in business?

How long a company has been in business, and more importantly how much experience they have with weddings, can be a telling detail. Experience is not always indicative of ability, but vendors with long track records

of success may prove easy to work with.

#### Are you insured?

Check if the vendor is insured. It can be a risky proposition to work with vendors who are not insured.

#### Will you be on site to oversee things?

From florists to private caterers to specialty performers, it is acceptable to ask vendors if they will be there the day of the wedding to manage things or if it will be a third party or another representative. Confirm all pertinent details, including who will be there on the day of the wedding, in advance.

#### What is your payment schedule and cancellation policy?

Understand how the vendor expects to be paid. Many businesses require a deposit up front to book the date. Some may want payment in full a week or so before the wedding day. Others may enable you to make monthly payments for a set period of time. Ask how the vendor handles cancellations, and whether any deposit or portion of the money already paid will be refunded.

#### When is the last possible date for making changes?

Know how long you have to make any changes to your plans, colors, music choices, or other details.

#### Are there any additional fees?

It's important to determine if gratuity, travel, overtime charges, cleaning fees, or any other charges are included in the contract or if it leaves room for additional expenses.

#### Is mine your only wedding that day? How do you handie conflicts?

Figure out if the vendor handles just one wedding per day or if they have staff to cover multiple weddings on a given date.

#### Do prices differ depending on time of day, month or year?

Certain dates are busier than others. Find out if the vendor charges a premium for holidays or particular times of the year.

Couples are urged to exercise due diligence and ensure contracts with vendors specify all details before signing on the dotted line.

#### 'Cause I was gonna be your forever...




The couple went to Hawaii for their honeymoon, and stayed in a resort on the big island. "We had a beach view from the ocean side, which was really, really pretty," Nick said.
